

“A Community Outreach Intervention to Link Individuals with Opioid Use Disorders to Medication-Assisted Treatment ”

Research Questions

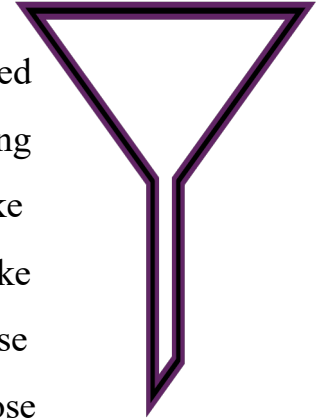
- Is a peer outreach intervention feasible?
- Is the modified Recovery Management Checkup (RMC) intervention effective at engaging individuals?
- What predicts if a person moves through the successive stages of the intervention?

Methods

Peer outreach workers approached individuals in the community, passed out program fliers, and connected those interested with the program. A **linkage manager** met with participants and used RMC to move client through to next stage. **Community-based MAT** provided medication. Used logistic regression to analyze predictors of movement through intervention stages.

Sample

3,308 – Eligible
 1,638 – Eligible, agreed
 972 – Attended meeting
 890 – Scheduled intake
 765 – Completed intake
 696 – Received 1st dose
 670 – Received 2nd dose
 498 – In tx 30 days post 1st dose



Findings

Stage	More Likely	Less Likely
Attended linkage meeting	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • African American • 50-59 years old • Past MAT treatment • Any SUD treatment in past 6 months 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hispanic, white, and other races/ethnicities • Younger individuals
Attended MAT intake	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 19-29 and 30-39 years old • Stable housing 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Homelessness • Living at shelter • ER visit in past year • Other drug use in past year
Continued MAT participation 30 days after first dose	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Blue Cross Blue Shield health ins. • 50-59 years old • Past MAT treatment 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Weekly cocaine use • 30-39 years old

TAKE-AWAYS

- ✓ Community-based outreach can effectively connect potential clients to MAT treatments.
- ✓ Modified Recovery Management Checkup (RMC) intervention effective at engaging individuals in treatment.
- ✓ Those more vulnerable and with fewer resources need more intensive efforts to engage in treatment.
